

## Approximate Mule Deer Gestation Table-203 days

Mule deer (Odocoileus hemionus) are named for their large mule-like ears and robust body form. They also have a distinct brownish-gray coat color with a white patch on their rump and a white tail with a black tip. Unlike white-tailed deer, their tail is not raised when alarmed. The rut for mule deer begins in the fall, usually from late November to early December. Females will be in estrous for about 24 hours and will cycle every 28 days if not bred. Does usually give birth to twins, although in many first pregnancies only a single is born. When ready to fawn, does will ususally isolate themselves and if possible find an area with dense, thick brush. Mature bucks weigh from 150-200 lbs or more and females weigh 100-150 lbs.
